As your service provider, Bay View Refuse understands the critical role our service provides in relation to maintaining a safe and healthy community.



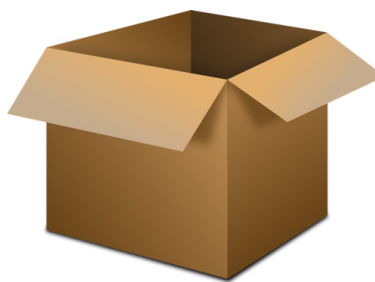
RULES FOR CARDBOARD RECYCLING



At this time, we are overwhelmed with cardboard. For our drivers to efficiently pick up your cardboard boxes, we ask:

- Break down and tie or tape together in manageable bundles and place at the curb next to recycling can.
- If broken down boxes are smaller, they can be placed in the recycling can **AS LONG AS THE LID FITS ON THE CAN.**

- ✓ Newspaper
- ✓ Envelopes
- ✓ Junk mail
- ✓ Paperback books
- ✓ Brochures
- ✓ Magazines
- ✓ Copy/printer paper

Cardboard



- ✓ Cardboard boxes tied or taped in bundles
- ✓ Egg cartons
- ✓ File folders
- ✓ Poster board
- ✓ Cereal type boxes
- ✓ Milk cartons
- ✓ Tubes from toilet paper and paper towels

Aluminum/Metal



- ✓ Aluminum beverage cans
- ✓ Steel/tin food cans
- ✓ Empty aerosol cans
- ✓ Aluminum foil, roasting pans

Glass



- ✓ Glass bottles
- ✓ Glass jars, all colors

Plastic



- ✓ Water bottles
- ✓ Mixed rigid plastic packaging/food containers

Non-Recyclable Items

- ✗ Aseptic carton, (i.e. soy/soup)
- ✗ Batteries
- ✗ Clothing
- ✗ Food Waste
- ✗ Mirror/window/ drinking glasses
- ✗ Ceramics, plates/mugs
- ✗ Ashes of any kind
- ✗ Styrofoam
- ✗ Tissue, paper towels /plates
- ✗ Food contaminated paper products.
- ✗ Plastic bags/utensils
